

Tips from Literacy Experts How to Get Your Message Across

Skilled Readers	Poor Readers	How to Get Your Message Across
Interpret meaning	Take words literally	Explain the meaning
Read with fluency	Read slowly, miss meaning	Use common words and examples
Get help for uncommon words (may not be true for some patients)	Skip over the word	Use examples and review
Understand the context	 Miss the context, problem solving, and synthesizing the information 	Tell context first and use visuals
Persistent	Tire quickly	 Use short sentences and easy to read layouts
Problem-solving skills	Poor problem-solving skills	Go through problem-solving process and teach this skill
Formulate questions	Difficulty asking questions	Teach them how to ask questions about their health
Perceive ideas correctly	Limited perception of ideas	Be concrete rather than abstract
Handle more than one piece of information at a time	Struggle with more than one piece of information at a time	• Limit the amount of information given at one time and break down complex information into small segments.
